Intro to Bargaining

On June 30, 2019, our current Collective Agreement will expire. The BCTF Bargaining Conference is scheduled for the Fall of 2018, after which bargaining will be opened.

Our Bargaining Committee has met several times already this year and we are starting the process early to ensure member engagement and input. This month Staff Reps were provided with a "Preparing for Bargaining" workshop to enable them to have school site meetings to help share that information with school staffs.

However, knowing that not all Staff Reps were able to attend and that there are a few sites who still need a Rep, we wanted to provide members with more entry points to help demystify the bargaining process and to help prepare Surrey teachers for what to expect as bargaining approaches.

We want you to be involved in the bargaining of **your** contract. There are important aspects of bargaining that are provincial and local. Come be involved in the process towards a successful new contract by June 30, 2019.

Term Assignments

Have you been placed into a "term assignment" for 2 consecutive years? We want to hear from you!



Meaning that you had a job for the duration of the school year, but it would not be a continuing assignment beyond June 2017. Did the same thing happen this year? Was your placement into "term" position, one that won't continue beyond June 2018? The STA's grievance officers are collecting data and would like to hear from anyone affected. Qualifications Deadline for Positions Requiring Special Training/ Experience

We are expecting that there will be a large number of postings for positions that require special training or specific experience, especially LST and IST teachers for next school year. In order to be shortlisted in Rounds 1 and 2, teachers need to be listed in the District Qualification Book.

Teachers who are interested in changing their assignments to such positions need to apply to the **Human Resources Department by January 31 to have their qualifications evaluated**. The evaluation will be completed by March 31. (CA, Article E.28.1)

Assessment Issues in the Secondary Classroom: **Challenges and Possibilities**

This workshop addresses issues in assessment, evaluation, and grading practices in secondary schools. Issues discussed will include the balance of formative and summative assessment, the use of zero as a mark, marks deductions for late work and other work habit issues, grading group work, averaging marks across the semester/year, re-dos, and retakes. This workshop supports the directions of the revised curriculum and can incorporate core competency based reflections.

(This workshop complements the Assessment for Learning workshop and can be booked in conjunction or separately. If both workshops are being considered it is advised that Assessment Issues in the Secondary Classroom be booked to begin this conversation).
