STARA Meeting & Election of Pensions Chair

Hey teachers! Did you know that the next STARA meeting is scheduled for **Wednesday, April 18 at 4:00 PM**? Everyone is welcome to attend! This is an opportunity to check in with schools from across the district and hear what kinds of issues they've been facing at their sites. Members of the STA Executive will be available to answer any questions, and Grievance Officers will provide an update. During this meeting, there will be an election for the position of Pensions Chairperson.

If you are a School Union Representative, please ensure that at least one representative from your school is able to be there to vote for the election of Pensions Chairperson, and the Executive recommendations being presented.

Please note: Although any member may attend a STARA meeting, only staff reps, members of the Executive Committee, and representatives of standing committees are eligible to vote.

If you're interested in running for the position of Pensions Chairperson, please come to the meeting!

The duties of this position under our Policies and Procedures are to:

- keep the members of the Association informed regarding pension matters by holding a minimum of one seminar on pensions issues per year;
- accept or initiate for discussion and possible action, proposals for the changing of the Pensions Act; and
- study proposals of the BCTF Pensions Committee and propose amendments, if it appears in the best interest of the teachers to do so

In addition, the Pensions Chairperson may recommend for Executive approval, a committee of up to 4 additional STA members at least one of whom should be a retired teacher.

Lost Prep for Teachers Retiring or Leaving District

Under the Collective Agreement, employees who lose prep are entitled to prep recovery "at a time agreed to as convenient to the school administration and the employees involved" (Art. D.4.9.c). Prep that is not recovered by the end of the year carries over to the next school year (Art. D.4.9.f).

The Collective Agreement does not provide for the recovery of lost prep via monetary payout. Although, historically, there have been occasions when the District has agreed to monetary payouts of prep time owed, when the STA approached the District late last school year about doing so again, their response was no.

The Collective Agreement also does specify what happens if a teacher, who is owed prep that has not been repaid, leaves the District, such as when they retire.

If you are approaching retirement and are owed lost prep, our advice is to:

- a. flag the issue for your principal, and ask how you will be able to recover your lost prep before retirement, and
- b. inform the STA (via email to 1st VP, **MATT WESTPHAL**) that you are nearing the end of your employment with the District and still have lost prep. It is easier for us to advocate on behalf of members in this situation where we have specific examples.

School Union Representative Training - April 18, 19, 23, & 24, 2018

Creating Inclusive Spaces: Applying an Equity and Inclusion Lens to Your Local, Schools and Classrooms

This workshop will provide teachers with strategies to help contribute to more inclusive environments. Participants will be introduced to a number of barriers to inclusion based on race, gender identity, sexual orientation, class and physical ability. They will then explore strategies and resources available on the BCTF Equity and Inclusion webpages to address these barriers. Through an inquiry model, participants can begin thinking about specific actions they can take in their classrooms, schools, locals, and communities.

Settlement Agreement: Failure to Shortlist Candidates on the Basis of Seniority

At the end of the 2016 school year, the Surrey Teachers' Association filed a grievance regarding the fact that the Employer had engaged in the practice of not shortlisting teachers according to seniority while awarding positions in Rounds One and Two.

Even though there is language in the Collective Agreement (Article E.28.6) that talks about the steps that need to be followed while awarding positions, we believed that it was not always adhered to and that teachers with more seniority were sometimes skipped in the process. Recently, we have signed a Letter of Agreement with the Employer that clarifies the shortlisting process. It specifies that all qualified applicants will be shortlisted in order of seniority and that all applicants who are shortlisted will be offered interviews. Pension Update

Did you know that the BCTF pension program underwent some changes, and a "new era" started on **January 1, 2018**? The changes bring equity among all members (classroom teacher or TTOC) and increase the lifetime pension amount.

Over Spring Break, the Pension Report was presented at the BCTF Annual General Meeting. It included the good news that the plan is performing better than expected, resulting in a surplus.
