

The final STARA Meeting of 2018 will commence at 4:00 pm on Wednesday, December 19 at Eaglequest Golf Centre. Following the meeting, there will be a social event. We look forward to seeing you there!

Do you want to go to the BCTF AGM in Victoria this year?

The BCTF Annual General Meeting will take place from **March 16-19, 2019** at the Victoria Conference Centre.

Each year over 750 delegates from around the province attend the BCTF AGM. It is a great opportunity to see how the BCTF operates, to hear new perspectives on important issues, meet colleagues from other parts of the province, and to have a voice in the decisions made by the union. Surrey is able to send up to 60 delegates. Under the STA's Policies and Procedures, the 10 members of the Resolutions Committee will automatically be delegates, therefore we will need to elect **50 delegates** plus alternates. Hotel accommodations and expenses are covered by the BCTF. Childcare arrangements are also available.

Delegates will be elected at the Special General Meeting on January 23 at the Bombay Banquet Hall.

Elected delegates and alternates are expected to attend all training sessions leading up to the AGM.

February 21 - AGM Delegates training (3:30 pm to 6:00 pm at Eaglequest).

Elementary Teacher-Librarians and Prep Time

It has come to our attention that some elementary Teacher-Librarians have been assigned to teach more than K - 4/5 prep, as part of the school's Library Entitlement. This should not be happening. Elementary Teacher-Librarian entitlement is based on the school's projected enrolment from the previous spring, at a 1:500 ratio. Out of that library entitlement, the TL teaches 40 minutes of prep for each K - 4/5 division at the school, schedules in their own prep time and Library Admin time, and the rest of their schedule is for collaboration time, which may include scheduled intermediate book exchange times.

Generally, the only way that TLs should be teaching any prep above K - 4/5 is if the school "purchases" library service with their intermediate prep allotment, thereby increasing the percentage that a part-time TL is at the school.

Sometimes an administrator will assign some intermediate prep to a TL because they can't see any other way of providing prep to intermediate teachers, particularly if, for example, classroom teachers teach their own French. This, however, is a school-based staffing error which leads to schools losing out on library collaboration time and erodes library service district-wide. Once the school team has established positive results from working as a team at the school level, gathering information from members and sharing information with members during the bargaining process should become more efficient and meaningful. The ultimate goal is to engage more members at all phases of the bargaining process.
