BCTF AGM in Victoria: We are Still Accepting Applications

Due to the overwhelming response, we are still accepting names and candidate statements for BCTF AGM Delegates. If you are interested in becoming a delegate, please email your name and a brief statement to sta@surreyteachers.org by Thursday, January 17th. Remember, your chances of being elected as a delegate are much better if you have a written statement! It is also possible to nominate yourself from the floor at the meeting. The BCTF Annual General Meeting will take place from **March 16-19, 2019** at the Victoria Conference Centre.

Each year over 750 delegates from around the province attend the BCTF AGM. It is a great opportunity to see how the BCTF operates, to hear new perspectives on important issues, meet colleagues from other parts of the province, and to have a voice in the decisions made by the union. Surrey can send up to 63 delegates. Under the STA's Policies and Procedures, the 10 members of the Resolutions Committee will automatically be delegates, so we will need to elect **53 delegates** plus alternates. Hotel accommodations, travel costs, and expenses are covered by the BCTF. Childcare arrangements are also available.

Delegates will be elected at the **Special General Meeting** at 4pm on **January 23rd** at the **Bombay Banquet Hall**.

Elected delegates and alternates are expected to attend all training sessions leading up to the AGM.


Can You Help with Primary, Intermediate Sites or Excursions?

Keynote speaker

Dr. Lauryn Oates

Dr. Lauryn Oates is a women's human rights activist focused on education in conflict zones.

Lauryn is Executive Director with Canadian Women for Women in Afghanistan, a Canadian charity that leads education projects in Afghanistan including teacher training, village libraries, literacy classes, schools and training programs, and the Darakht-e Danesh Digital Library, an award-winning repository of open educational resources in languages spoken in Afghanistan.

She is a fierce proponent of the universalism of human rights, and frequently speaks out for

global citizenship in the Canadian and international media. She is the recipient of several awards and distinctions, including a Queen's Diamond Jubilee Medal awarded by the province of BC.

Drawing from her work advancing education in Afghanistan, Lauryn shares insights that ring true in the mud classrooms of rural Central Asia as much as in the modern classrooms of the industrialized world.





We Asked the Board, and They Answered

Every month members of the STA executive attend the School Board meetings representing the teachers. (If any member would like to join us, you are invited!) Unfortunately, it is not possible to ask questions in the meeting (and have them recorded in the official minutes,) so along with other members of the public, we ask questions after the meeting is adjourned, and receive answers by email a couple of weeks later. Here are two questions we asked recently, and the answers we received, for your information. We will continue asking questions, and reporting back to you in the Monday Memo, whatever answers we receive. If you have questions you would like us to ask, please let us know.

Nov 21 Board meeting

Out of concern for all the problems with kids not getting the specialist service they need, we asked: "Will the school board initiate a process of discovery to determine whether specialist staffing is adequate to meet the children's needs?"

Answer: This question will be added to the agenda for the next STA Executive/SD36 Senior Team Monthly Liaison Meeting for further discussion.

At the monthly meeting on Dec 18th, Jordan Tinney reported back to us, saying, "short answer, no".

Dec 12 Board meeting

We asked, out of concern for the extreme crowding at KB Woodward Elementary, "Is the Board considering renovating the building housing City Central Learning Centre back to an elementary school to house the burgeoning student body in the neighbourhood?"

Answer: Our Five Year Capital Plan is located on our district website at this link: https://www.surreyschools.ca/Publications/Five-Year%20Capital%20Plan%202019-2020.pdf

On that Capital Plan KB Woodward Elementary is listed as our 11th priority for an eight classroom addition. KB Woodward Elementary will alleviate the growing population in that area surrounding City Central Learning Centre. In addition, looking long term you can also find that École Kwantlen Park Secondary is also listed for an addition moving it from a 1200 capacity school to a capacity of 1500. Specifically to your question, the Board is not considering renovating the Learning Centre but as stated is expanding KB Woodward Elementary.

Qualifications Deadline for Positions Requiring Special Training/Experience: Get into the Qualified Book!

We are expecting that there will be a large number of postings for positions that require special training or specific experience, especially LST and IST teachers for the next school year. In order to be shortlisted in Rounds 1 and 2, teachers need to be listed in the District Qualification Book. Teachers who are interested in changing their assignments to such positions need to apply to the Human Resources Department by **January 31st** to have their qualifications evaluated. The evaluation will be completed by March 31. (CA, Article E.28.1)


