The BCTF will be holding its 2nd annual Women's Institute: Bread and Roses; Gathering Strength, Gaining Ground from 7:00 pm on Thursday, March 7 to 1:00 pm on Saturday, March 9, 2019, at the Pacific Gateway Hotel in Richmond.

The purpose of this event is to:

1. Create an opportunity for members who identify as women to share their experiences, build community, and learn new leadership skills and strategies together.

2. Support and inspire women's leadership in the workplace, union, and broader community.

3. Deepen understanding of women's issues, feminist analyses, intersectionality, and effective collective organizing.

4. Celebrate the contributions of women in the union, profession, and community.

5. Gather feedback from the participants' lived experiences as to the opportunities for, and challenges to, participation at the school, local, and community levels.

This event has been described as "life-changing". Our Surrey delegate from last year ended up successfully pursuing leadership on our Executive Committee, and she credits her sparked interest in leadership to what she learned at the Women's Institute.

Each local has been asked to select one delegate to attend again this year. The BCTF will also be appointing an additional 20 delegates selected from the membership at large, with preference given to those who, in addition to identifying as women, are members of other equity-seeking groups and who did not attend the 2017–18 Women's Institute.


Can You Help with Primary, Intermediate Sites or Excursions?

How is information turned into knowledge? Under what conditions do people learn? What is the role of education in the development of societies? She holds a BA in international development (McGill University), an MA in human security (Royal Roads University) and a PhD in language and literacy education (University of British Columbia). She has taught graduate students at the School of Humanitarian Studies at Royal Roads University since 2014.

In the past, we have had dances inspired by graphing formulas in pre-calc, a dance that was inspired by the novels and short stories read in English, dances created to illustrate the idea of assimilation that they learned from social studies and dances that speak to social justice topics like gender roles, homelessness, bullying etc.

This year the show includes dances from the following Surrey Secondary School dance programs: Fleetwood Park, North Surrey, Sullivan Heights, Frank Hurt and Salish Secondary! The show will vary in dance genres from hip-hop to contemporary to break dancing. There will be live dance performances as well as dance videos created using their skills from digital media 11/12.

Qualifications Deadline for Positions Requiring Special Training/Experience: Get into the Qualified Book!

We are expecting that there will be a large number of postings for positions that require special training or specific experience, especially LST and IST teachers for the next school year. In order to be shortlisted in Rounds 1 and 2, teachers need to be listed in the District Qualification Book. Teachers who are interested in changing their assignments to such positions need to apply to the Human Resources Department by **January 31st** to have their qualifications evaluated. The evaluation will be completed by March 31. (CA, Article E.28.1)
