JENNIFER WADGE SOCIAL JUSTICE AWARD

Jennifer Wadge was the President of the Surrey Teachers' Association from 2012 until her untimely death in 2015. She was a graduate of Surrey public schools and taught at a number of elementary schools in Surrey. She was a dedicated and passionate supporter of teachers and students, she championed social activism, and she believed whole-heartedly in the importance of an adequately funded public education system.

She was known for her clear thinking, her articulate incisive views, her composed demeanour, and her passion for the issues. Jennifer was deeply committed to the principles of social justice, seeing them as a cornerstone of our work an equitable society.

The STA annually bestows four social justice awards of \$2,000 in the Spring to successful applicants attending schools in the Surrey School District.

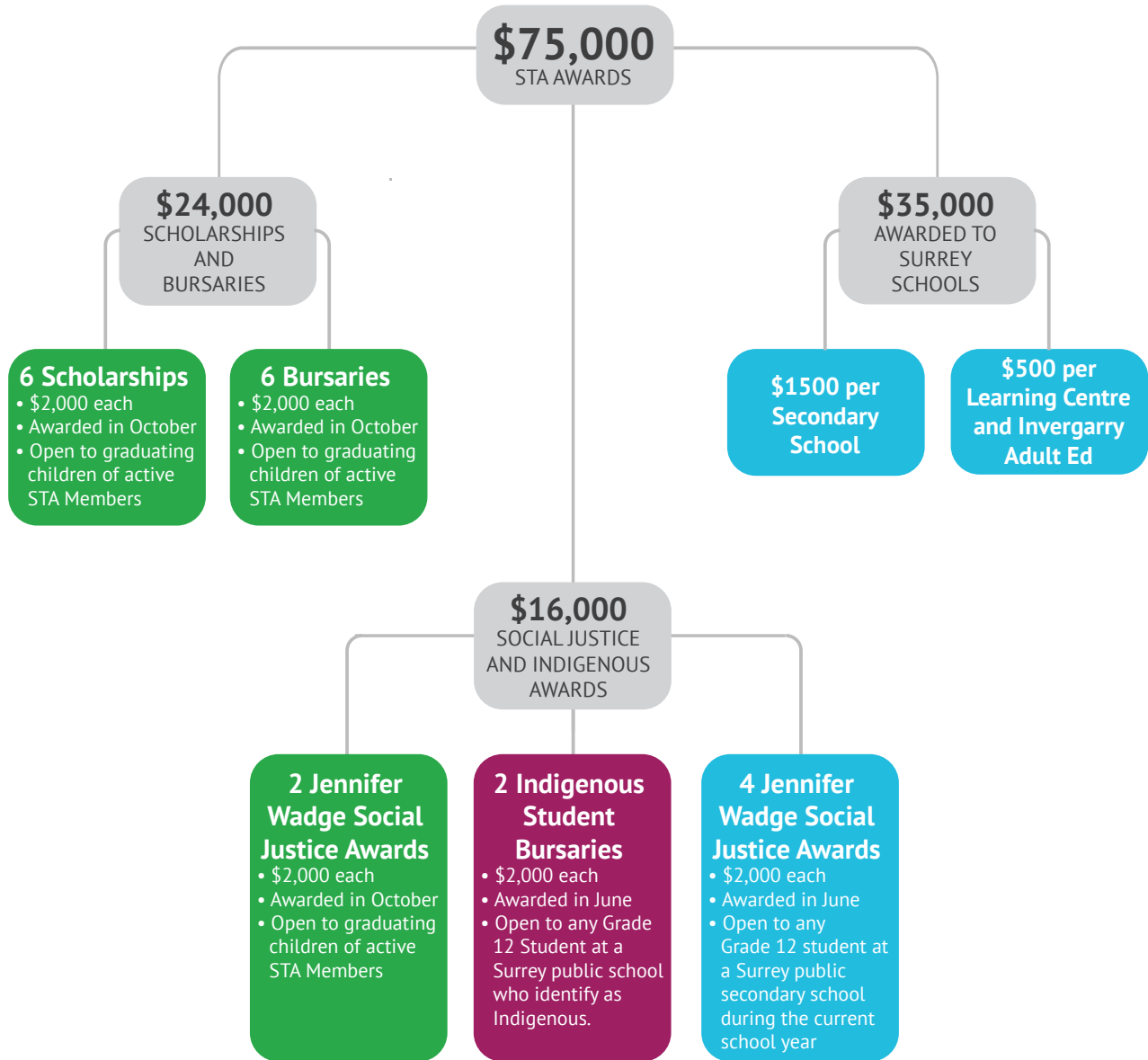
