Changes to Extended Health Benefits for TTOCs

In response to a recent arbitration regarding extended health benefits (EHB), BCPSEA has unilaterally created a new provincial plan specifically for TTOCs. This plan is administered by Pacific Blue Cross (PBC) and is only for TTOCs and not contract teachers. While the new plan provides the same coverage as the regular provincial plan, the BCTF is concerned that the new plan for TTOCs contains changes to premiums and additional restrictive terms.

Despite our concerns, because there is a deadline of October 31 to apply to PBC for coverage, it is very important that TTOCs submit their application forms as soon as possible and arrange to remit payment directly to PBC. Any late applicants have to provide evidence of good health and may be denied EHB coverage due to medical conditions. See the attached documents for more information.

Failure To Fill

The STA has filed a grievance regarding the District's practice to direct non-enrolling teachers to cover failure to fill for classroom teachers. The STA is therefore collecting data to support this grievance by requesting that staff reps regularly report failures to fill. In an effort to make this task as quick and efficient as possible, we have created a new format

TTOC Experience Transfer Form

Your pay increment (step level) is based on your teaching experience. Contract teachers move up one step on the pay scale after 10 months of full-time experience. Incremental increases take place automatically on September 1 and January 1 each year.

The next incremental increase will be January 1, 2020. Contract teachers should have their <u>form</u> into Payroll, no later than November 15, 2019, in order to receive an increase on January 1, 2020. BCTF Grants Available

The <u>Ed May Social Responsibility Education Fund</u> deadline is fast approaching on November 21, 2019 at 5:00 pm, while the <u>Local Social Justice Grants</u> are now on a first come, first serve basis until April 10, 2020 at 5:00 pm.

The <u>Provincial Social Justice Initiatives Grant</u> is awarded on a yearly basis to support social justice projects that have an ongoing and systemic impact on teachers and students across the province and in their community. Projects may involve local community groups but should not be donations to these groups. The total amount of grant funds awarded in each school year is a maximum of \$5,000. This amount may be awarded to one applicant or divided between two applicants. The deadline is <u>December 2, 2019 at 5:00 pm.</u>

BCTF Opportunity for Members: BC Teachers' Council

There is a vacancy on the BC Teachers' Council for a BCTF appointee. The Council is responsible for setting standards for teachers in BC, including education, competence and professional conduct requirements. The BCTC also sets standard, reviews and approves post-secondary teacher education programs. <u>Applications</u> are due by 4:30 p.m. on November 8, 2019.

BCTF Employment Opportunity: Assistant Director, Field Service Division

Reporting to the Director of the Field Service Division and the Executive Director, this position provides support to locals in political action, contract enforcement, bargaining, communications, and the handling of a range of professional, social justice, Aboriginal education, and other issues. The role provides advice, assistance, and support to locals regarding the development of effective local structures and planning processes, and

administration and enforcement of the collective agreement up to and including Step 3 of the grievance procedure. The deadline to <u>apply</u> is 5:00 p.m., Friday, November 1, 2019.


Opportunity for Students: CBC Indigenous Junior J School
