TTOC Experience Transfer Form

Your pay increment (step level) is based on your teaching experience. Contract teachers move up one step on the pay scale after 10 months of full-time experience. Incremental increases take place automatically on September 1 and January 1 each year.

The next incremental increase will be January 1, 2020. Contract teachers should have their form into Payroll, no later than November 15, 2019, in order to receive an increase on January 1, 2020. White Poppies for Peace

The white poppy represents a culture of peace and was first introduced in Britain in 1933. These white poppies can be worn alone, or alongside the red poppy to show your commitment to ending war and to recognize all its victims. Vancouver Peace Poppies offers ideas and resources for teachers to explore the broader impacts of war and reflect on the experiences of recent immigrants, keeping Remembrance Day relevant to students' lives and interests. Vancouver Peace Poppies runs an annual campaign to distribute white


peace poppies across Canada and you can order subsidized white poppies for your school using this form.

Aboriginal Veterans have served both in Canada's Military Forces and as allies, from the formative times of the War of 1812 to the present.
