

The BCTF Annual General Meeting will take place from **March 14-17, 2020** at the Hyatt Regency Hotel, Vancouver.

Each year over 750 delegates from around the province attend the BCTF AGM. It is a great opportunity to see how the BCTF operates, to hear new perspectives on important issues, meet colleagues from other parts of the province, and to have a voice in the decisions made by the union. Surrey can send up to 62 delegates. Under the STA's Policies and Procedures, the members of the Resolutions Committee will automatically be delegates, therefore we will need to elect **53 delegates** plus alternates. Hotel accommodations and expenses are covered by the BCTF. Childcare arrangements are also available.

Delegates will be elected at the **Special General Meeting** on **January 22** at the **Bombay Banquet Hall**. Elected delegates and alternates are expected to attend all training sessions leading up to the AGM, and the 7 am breakfast caucus meetings each day during the AGM.

February 10 – Rookie AGM Delegates training (8:30 am to 3:30 pm at STA).

February 20 - AGM Delegates training (3:30 pm to 6:00 pm at Eaglequest).

February 26 – AGM Delegates training (8:30 am to 2:45 pm at Eaglequest).

March 5 – AGM Delegates training (3:30 pm to 6:00 pm at Eaglequest).

If you are interested in becoming a delegate, please email your name and a brief statement to sta@surreyteachers.org by Friday, January 10. Remember, your chances of being elected as a delegate are much better if you have a written statement! It is also possible to nominate yourself from the floor at the meeting. Do you want to go to the Canadian Teachers' Federation AGM this year?

The next Annual General Meeting of the Canadian Teachers' Federation (CTF) will be held in Ottawa on July 8 to July 10, 2020. As a CTF member organization, the BCTF will send up to 12 delegates. Our delegation is made up of six members elected by the BCTF Representative Assembly with the remaining number of delegates chosen by the BCTF Executive Committee. All BCTF members are eligible to put their name forward for election to be one of the delegates chosen by the Representative Assembly when it meets on January 31 and February 1, 2020. You can learn more about the opportunity and the selection process online. To apply, please submit the online application form by 5:00 p.m. on Monday, January 13, 2020.

Nominations Open for Prestigious BCTF Awards

Nominations are now open for the Federation's most coveted awards. The winners are invited to the Annual General Meeting to be honoured by colleagues from across the province.

- The <u>Bob Rosen Social Justice Award</u> is granted to a member or honorary associate member who
 has made an outstanding and sustained contribution in working for systemic change on issues of
 social justice. Applications are due by January 31, 2020.
- The <u>Stewart Schon Award</u> is granted to a member or honorary associate member who has made
 an outstanding and sustained contribution to the health and safety of BCTF members. Applications
 are due by January 31, 2020.

- The <u>G.A. Fergusson Award</u> is granted annually to a BCTF member (or former member) who has made an outstanding contribution to public education. Applications are due by February 10, 2020.
- Nominations are also open for <u>Honorary Life Memberships</u>. Applications are due by February 10, 2020.
