Upcoming Political Action to Support Bargaining

To raise awareness with parents and the public about bargaining issues, we have various political actions planned, including two this week.

1. Burma Shaves: First one Thursday, February 27



A "Burma Shave" is a roadside rally where people hold signs that spell out a short phrase for people passing by on the street. It's a simple and visually effective way of communicating a message to lots of people!

Please feel warmly invited to participate in one of our upcoming Burma Shaves on Feb 27th (after school in front of the STA office), March 3 on 100th Avenue near152 Street, and March 5th on 152 in front of Eagle Quest. (at 78th) This is our chance to garner public support, or at least honks, in our quest for a fair contract. All events will run approximately from 3:15 pm to 4:15 pm.

2. School Walk-Ins to Support National Day of Action, Friday, February 28

The awesome staff at Riverdale Elementary are planning a walk-in before school on Friday, and challenge other schools to do the same!

What is a Walk-In?

A Walk-In in a group of teachers meeting 20 minutes before school and walking in together, at the same time, to garner attention and signal to parents that things are not entirely as they should be. Walk-Ins are being organized for the National Day of Action to support public education on Friday, February 28th.

3 easy steps to organize a Walk-In at your school:

1. Call a union meeting before Friday to plan with your colleagues (remember you have a budget for snacks!) or send an email to all staff. Plan to wear red and encourage your colleagues to do the same - scarves, hats, shirts, shoes - all red is welcome!

Optionally, pick up materials for your Walk-In (we have signs, flags, and buttons) from the STA office, 9030 King George Blvd, any time before. Please check before coming, in case we run out.

- On Friday, wear red and meet with your colleagues 20 minutes prior to the morning bell in a visible location. If you are on a busy street, that is ideal. Close to an overpass? Even better! We have some large signs for those locations. Take photos! Share on social media and tag #RedforEd #RedforBCed.
- 3. Walk in en masse, 15 minutes before the bell take a short video to share on social media. Here's an example: <u>https://twitter.com/SurreyTeachers/status/1199473048996311041/video/1</u>

News from last week's Special General Meeting

We made a couple of changes to our bylaws that will be interesting to members.

First, we added another released table officer position for next year, the "Accommodations Support Officer," which will greatly enhance the ability of the STA to support members who are accessing medical accommodations and supports. The position essentially splits the current "Health and Safety Grievance Officer" position in two, so that both will be more effective, because we also have many concerns about Health and Safety issues in the schools, and lots to pay attention to with new school construction and ongoing issues with renovations, etc. The new position will be a 2-year term, and the first officer in this position will be elected at our general meeting in May.

Second, we also voted to increase the maximum term for grievance officers to eight years. The rationale for this is to make sure the STA doesn't lose the knowledge base that a grievance officer builds up over their years of service, which is really important when we are facing the employer in grievances and arbitrations. It is still important, however, that a person eventually moves back into the classroom to give other interested members a chance to do this work and to accumulate this important knowledge and carry the STA into the future, defending our members with this valuable knowledge.

Elections for the full-time table officer positions and the rest of the STA executive committee will occur at the Annual General Meeting in May. We will have a call out later this spring for those interested in running to submit a candidate statement.

We also elected delegates to the Canadian Labour Congress convention which will be in Vancouver in May. This is usually in Toronto, Ottawa or Montreal, so it is a good chance for our local to participate in a national level meeting.

The YWC is looking for driven people to help plan social events to bring young workers together and create meaningful connections. LAC Film Night February 27, 2020


