Surrey teachers work on the unceded traditional territories of the Kwantlen, Katzie, Qayqayt and Semiahmoo First Nations. As part of meaningful reconciliation work, we reflect on the impacts of colonialism through self-education in order to be accountable to Indigenous people and pay attention to our students of Indigenous ancestry, providing them the tools for their success in the future. We are all on a path to learn more and understand the role of each of us as educators in healing the broken relationship with the First Peoples of this territory. We thank those who live on and care for the land.

Concern for Astra Zeneca risks and reactions

We have heard from members who are experiencing significant post-vaccine symptoms after having received the AstraZeneca/Covishield Vaccine before March 28. In addition, we know that there is also the added worry of wondering whether the more serious side-effects (which led to its use being suspended for people under 55) will materialize, and the frustration that, within days, a different vaccine without these issues was provided to District staff.

We are sorry that many of you are having to deal with these issues. At the time this vaccine was administered, its use was permitted by public health authorities, and everyone (the Centre for Disease Control, Public Health Office, Fraser Health, SD36, and the union) was relying on that approval. Vaccinating Surrey school staff as soon as possible made sense to provide people with that added protection quickly, given their risk of exposure at work. Now that this vaccine has been suspended for people under 55, people who have received it should monitor themselves for symptoms of the more serious side-effects, and seek medical attention as appropriate.

People are naturally wondering what will happen next, particularly around their next dose. The simple answer is that we don't know. Public health authorities and AstraZeneca are working on this issue, and should have it resolved by the time people would be due for a second shot.

However, at this time we do not know what vaccine that would be, or whether they will have any choice in vaccine. As soon as we have information on this or other issues about the vaccine, we will share it with members.

ONE YEAR OF COVID

One year ago this week we had to sign-up in order to go to our classrooms to pick up what we needed for the remote teaching adventure we were about to embark on. Remember climbing up that steep learning curve? Whew!

A year later, Surrey consistently has the highest numbers of Covid cases in BC as we learn to live and work in the hot zone of a pandemic. But, the good news is that, after seven months of persistent advocacy on multiple levels, not only have Surrey teachers been prioritized for vaccinations but we also now have a Grades 4-12 mask mandate as ordered by the Chief Medical Officer for Fraser Health.

Even though we now have a mask mandate for Grades 4-12, we continue to roll-out and promote our <u>videos in many languages</u> to appeal to parents to send their children to school with a mask, including those in K-3 for whom the mask mandate does not apply. You can check out all the videos in our YouTube channel, and soon we will be adding Russian, Farsi, Japanese and Greek! Please help promote the message of mask compliance with parents and through social media if you speak any of the languages used in the videos.

Just before Spring break we learned about Enhanced and Targeted Measures that the District must now implement. Each Health and Safety Committee needs to fully engage in discussions with school administration about how these measures are being implemented. It's especially important that staff know how to bring concerns forward without fear. The facilitation of Enhanced and Targeted measures is fully within the purview of the H&S Committees.

As WorkSafeBC has confirmed, educators have the second highest number of approved claims which is why it's crucially important that we fully follow the measures aimed at reducing the possibility of transmission between and among colleagues.

It's been a hard slog for the past year and we may not all be feeling refreshed after spring break as we would be in the "Before Times" but we hope that being vaccinated and having a mask mandate along with the Enhanced and Targeted measures goes a long way to easing anxiety while we continue to do the best we can teaching during this historic pandemic.

2021 BCTF AGM report

From 20-23 March 2021 the BCTF AGM was held online. 35 Surrey delegates shared the 66 votes that our union is entitled to. Days started early for the Surrey delegates with a Breakfast Caucus meeting at 7:45 to prepare for each day's meeting which began at 9am and ended at 6pm.

Although being online all day for 4 days in a row was onerous, there were many great moments as the Surrey delegates, under the deft leadership of Marilyn Carr and Gavin Hainsworth, brought their comedic selves to lighten the mood between debates and discussions that were difficult at times.

Violette Baillargeon was re-elected to another two-year term as Member-at-Large on the BCTF Executive Committee. President Teri Mooring, First Vice-President Clint Johnston, and Second Vice-President Carole Gordon were acclaimed to return to their positions for another year.

The delegation was proud to watch our 2nd VP, Jatinder Bir, remain firm but friendly when barraged by multiple Points of Order and Points of Privilege during the various sessions she chaired throughout.

Among Surrey Resolutions that were passed was one to declare 4th October as "Sisters in Spirit Day" to honour the lives of Missing and Murdered Indigenous Women and Girls and another to support calls to lower the voting age to 16.

There was a concerted effort over two days to pass a resolution aimed at triggering a move to Stage 3 in the Covid Restart Plan. This would mean going to remote learning, when Covid cases are above 5% in communities. Surrey delegates were instrumental in finally getting an amended version of this resolution passed when only a few hours remained for the AGM. Since then there's been a submission to the Labour Relations Board by the BCTF to resolve issues around ventilation and density.

A highlight of the AGM was the Keynote address by Dr Shauneen Pete who presented a masterclass in what it means to be in a Just Relationship with each other and the land. Delegates were profoundly moved by her words.

Do consider joining us for AGM 2022 to gain a deep understanding of how the BCTF functions and learn about the range of opinions and ideas amongst hundreds of delegates representing all 47,000 teachers in B.C. Let's hope it is in person!

Important Notice for Teachers on Pregnancy, Parental or Compassionate Care Leave 2019-2020

When our last contract was settled in the Spring of 2020, teachers were given a retroactive pay increase of 2% for the 2019-2020 school year. The Surrey School District did not apply that retroactive increase to the top-up for those on pregnancy, parental or compassionate care leave. We have filed a grievance and have been pursuing all avenues available to us to get them to do so. As part of our efforts we will be filing a complaint with the BC Human Rights Tribunal in the coming weeks. If you were on pregnancy, parental or compassionate care leave between June 30, 2019 and June 30, 2020, please contact Gavin Slade-Kerr, Health and Safety/Grievance Officer, at hs@surreyteachers.org, to be included in the complaint.

Job Share Deadline Extension

The Surrey School District and the Surrey Teachers' Association have signed an agreement that extends the April 1 job share deadline for members waiting for entitlements for their specific position. The deadline will be extended by one calendar week from the date that entitlements for a teacher's specific position were sent to principals. For example, If Core Music entitlements are sent out to principals on April 5th, Core Music teachers interested in job share would have until April 12th to provide the job share proposal to the principal. Principals will then have one week to provide applicants with a written approval or rejection. All other job share applications are due by

April 1st. Application should be made through the principal with a copy to the Human Resources Department. Please email questions to Erin Coleman at pd@surreyteachers.org.
