Surrey teachers work on the unceded traditional territories of the Kwantlen, Katzie, Qayqayt and Semiahmoo First Nations. As part of meaningful reconciliation work, we reflect on the impacts of colonialism through self-education in order to be accountable to Indigenous people and pay attention to our students of Indigenous ancestry, providing them the tools for their success in the future. We are all on a path to learn more and understand the role of each of us as educators in healing the broken relationship with the First Peoples of this territory. We thank those who live on and care for the land.

### Truth, Reconciliation, and Resilience

In the wake of the discovery of the remains of 215 children buried at the site of the former Kamloops Residential school, we extend our condolences to the Tk'emlúps te Secwépemc Nation, all the families that lost beloved children, and to the survivors and their descendants in our community who are experiencing intense feelings of sadness and loss.

As the Truth and Reconciliation Commission requested, we as educators must reflect on our role in reconciliation. We need to act with respect, solidarity and kindness in our work, and we need to do all we can to make sure that education is a path to healing and reconciliation among settlers and Indigenous people.

It's especially important this week not to expect our Indigenous colleagues to help with this learning. There is a plethora of <u>resources available</u>. Hearing the news about the Kamloops Residential School provides settlers with a challenge to do more during this year's Indigenous History Month to not only learn the truth about the colonization of these lands but also to celebrate the resilience of the First Nations who have lived here since time immemorial.

Colleen Lylia Scott, BFA B.Ed passed away suddenly and unexpectedly on 23 February 2021 at age 54. Colleen was warm and kind-hearted, with the soul of an artist, and a brilliant mind. She was an adventurer who travelled and lived abroad. Teaching English in Japan had a great influence on her. She loved and practised many forms of art: singing, acting, sculpture, photography, and painting. She was an inspiring teacher in Surrey BC for over 20 years, working with underprivileged children for most of her career. It was very important to her to make a difference by providing a fun, safe, and stable learning environment for children at school.

Colleen believed in helping others and expressed those beliefs through community work and teaching. She valued kindness and peace and was a great support to her friends and family. She was dearly loved and will be missed and remembered by her family, friends, students (old and new), and her rabbit Skittle.


