COLLECTIVE AGREEMENT UPDATES

New Reporting Policy

The Ministry of Education has released a draft form of a new K–12 Student Reporting Policy which includes significant changes to the current reporting order. Teachers, parents, and students have from now until November 5, 2021, to provide written comments and feedback. This policy is still a draft and should not change reporting practices this year. We are discussing it with the District and strongly encourage you to share concerns and feedback. Read more

Coverage for failures to fill

We are still awaiting legal advice on the interpretation of the provisions of the settlement agreement that affects coverage of failures to fill. We expect to have more information next week, and apologize for the delay.

HEALTH & SAFETY

BCTF Statement on Mandatory Vaccines

The vaccine mandate for public service workers does not apply to schools. School Boards are the employer who would be responsible for issuing a vaccine mandate. We would have no opposition to a mandate for school staff and would work with those who have medical exemptions to receive accommodation.

Masks

With the extension of the mask mandate, we recognize the potential to increase stress for teachers in seeking compliance from students. Please talk to your administrator: they are responsible for the health and safety in your school. Read more

Swish-and-Gargle Tests

If you are sending a student home who has signs of COVID-19, ask them or their parents to ask for a swish-and-gargle test when they sign-out at the front office. All Surrey schools were distributed swish-and-gargle tests for students who show symptoms of COVID-19 at school to take home to get tested. The test may be particularly useful for families that don't have a car to get to the testing centre in Cloverdale.

Cleaning

If a classroom has more than 10% of students absent for illness, contact your principal, who will then arrange with the District for disinfecting of desks, tables, and other surfaces that evening. You can follow up with your principal to ask if it was done.
