MARK KEELAN RETIREMENT

Mark became a teacher in 1984 and has been a Surrey teacher since 1990. He was the STA Grievance Officer for the first time from 2001 – 2002 and added Health & Safety to that portfolio from July 2002 until December 2004. He then moved on to working at the BCTF as a Health & Safety Officer from January 2005 until February 2009. He returned to being the STA Grievance Officer in 2017 until his retirement this month.

Mark always gave his full attention to matters he was dealing with and put in careful, detailed work. He advocated for members strongly and firmly. He was always willing to challenge views he did not agree with, and a phrase often heard by those who worked with him was "With all due respect,..."

Before he became a teacher, Mark worked in a number of different jobs. One of his favourites was managing a drive-in movie theatre on Vancouver Island. He often spoke fondly of the late nights and odd tasks that the job entailed.

When asked for retirement advice to pass on to members and friends, Mark said: "Take care of yourself so you can take care of others."

We are deeply grateful to Mark for many years of dedicated service to members and wish him a relaxing retirement free of grievances of any kind.

January 31 qualifications deadline reminder

In order to be shortlisted for jobs that require certain qualifications in Rounds 1 and 2, teachers need to be listed in the District Qualification Book. Teachers who are interested in changing their assignments to such positions need to apply to the Human Resources Department (courier #481) by January 31, 2022 to have their qualifications evaluated.
