**Secondary Teachers' Preparation Time** 

On November 19, 2021, the STA and the Employer have reached an <u>agreement that settles</u> <u>Grievance 20-21-011 regarding secondary teachers' preparation time for 2020/21 school year</u>. The Association filed a grievance on November 23, 2020, following the Employer's failure to provide appropriate preparation time to secondary teachers who taught in the quarter system. Secondary teachers are entitled to a minimum of 12.5% of total instructional time when averaged over the school year. <u>Read more</u>

January 31 qualifications deadline reminder

In order to be shortlisted for jobs that require certain qualifications in Rounds 1 and 2, teachers need to be listed in the District Qualification Book. Teachers who are interested in changing their assignments to such positions need to apply to the Human Resources Department (courier #481) by January 31, 2022 to have their qualifications evaluated.
