As educators, we are committed to actions aimed at healing the broken relationship between settlers and Indigenous peoples.

TRUTH AND RECONCILIATION

Information

At the start of a new semester or school year, one the most important tasks we have is learning the names of our students. Something to consider is the way the Canadian government in the 19th century forced First Nations to have European names. Consider the impact of that when a name carried great responsibility and was a form of intangible wealth. Learn more about the Indian Act naming policies here. Note that it was only in June 2021 that Indigenous people could apply to have their original names on official documents.

HEALTH AND SAFETY

Daily Health Check

Please use the updated <u>Daily Health Check and What To Do When Sick</u> which was recently released by the Ministry. The <u>Thrive Self Assessment tool</u> should no longer be used to do a daily health check, but is to be used to determine whether you should seek a COVID-19 test. COVID-19 public health guidance is rapidly changing. Please refer to the <u>BCCDC COVID-19 page</u> for the most current information.

Rapid Test Kit Distribution

The District will be distributing two Rapid Test Kits to employees in the following priority: Elementary Schools, then Secondary Schools, then Learning Centres, then District sites. Principals will distribute them at schools. District-based staff will receive kits from their departments directly (if they are not included on site lists). Dispatch staff (TTOC and Spare Board) will be emailed directly and asked to pick up their kits from REC (14123 92 Avenue) on a certain day (You will need ID). They anticipate this concluding February 4 including "catch up days". *Practicum teachers and staff that are on a full leave are not included in kit distribution at this time.*

WorkSafeBC claims for COVID-19 infection

Updated guidance now confirms that a positive test (PCR or otherwise) is not required for WorkSafeBC to adjudicate a COVID-19 claim. If you believe you contracted COVID-19 at work, we strongly encourage you to file a claim with WorkSafeBC. Filing a claim is important in the short term to protect your sick leave provisions. It's also important should you experience longer lasting effects related to contracting COVID-19. Read more


The First Black ...


Black History
