
TRUTH AND RECONCILIATION

GRIEVANCE



Message from Grievance Officer, Kelli O'Malley

In a unionized workplace, the grievance process is the normal method for settling disputes regarding employee rights. Unions depend on members bringing forward issues in order to actively defend the Collective Agreement rights of all teachers. If teacher rights are violated, and the union takes no action, it can be difficult to enforce those rights later.

The STA has two full-time Grievance Officers, Joanna Cerazy and Kelli O'Malley. Seven additional members are elected to the Grievance Committee, which examines grievance issues, makes recommendations, and receives training in defending the Collective Agreement. <u>STA Committees</u> are important structures within the STA. Run by volunteers, they usually meet once a month, after school.

Anti-Racism Committee

A motion was passed at the Special General Meeting in January that the Antiracism Committee be expanded by 3 seats, from 10 to 13 members, and at least 5 seats should be reserved for members identifying as Black, Indigenous, or a Person of Colour ("BIPOC"). RETHINKING PINK DAY

The first Pink Shirt Day was held in a Nova Scotia high school in 2007 when two Grade 12 students - Travis Price and David Shepard and a few friends - stood up against the homophobic bullying of a Grade 9 student who had a worn pink shirt to school. For Pink Shirt Day 2022, the LGBTQ2+ committee challenges STA members to "think beyond pink" by:

- acknowledging, respecting and naming the truth to this day's history,
- standing up against homophobic bullying,
- learning and unlearning our own gender and sexuality biases,
- building awareness and celebrating diverse SOGI identities, and by
- challenging dominant gender and sexuality norms and stereotypes.
