Truth and Reconciliation

When the Canadian government's Indian Act received Royal Assent on 12 April 1876, it defined an Indian as "any malé person of Indian blood". The Act extinguished all existing Indigenous self-government structures. In 2015, Bob Joseph, a member of the Gwawaenuk Nation, published a blog explaining some of the injustices of the Indian Act. The blog became the book, 21 Things You May Not Know About the Indian Act. You'll find teaching resources on the Indian Act here and also at the Secret Life of Canada podcast site.

Health and Safety

As you are aware, the <u>STA campaigned over several months</u> for the use of masks in schools when masking was not included in public health guidance for schools. Recently, Kasari Govender, BC's Human Rights Commissioner, <u>made public a letter she had sent to Dr. Bonnie Henry</u> a few days after the lifting of the mask mandate. In it she shared her concerns about the lifting of the mandate and said, "Given the benefits of the mask mandate for thousands of marginalized people and the minimal impact on those being asked to wear one, the balance at this time favours continuing the mask mandate".

While we continue to adjust to the removal of the mask mandate in schools, we encourage everyone to be tolerant of other people's decisions on mask wearing. Please be kind and accepting of everyone's choices in this matter.


Special General Meeting
