To gain a deeper understanding of the impact of these 'schools', contrast the 'education' of First Nations children at residential 'schools' with how they were educated before colonization. From page 7 on in this guide, you'll learn that before colonization First Nations educated their children in ways that were grounded in spiritual traditions. Children learned about their world through "storytelling, through example, and by participation in rituals, festivals, and individual coming-of-age ceremonies."


Getting ready for the AGM in May
