Job Share Day Swapping

We have heard from some job share partners that their principal is under the impression that day swapping (switching days without using a sick day or personal discretionary day) is discontinued. We have confirmed with the District that the practice of day swapping will continue until the conclusion of provincial bargaining. Variance to the Instruction Day

Article D.22.1 of the collective agreement limits the length of a school's instructional day. Some courses involve multi-grade classes that do not fit neatly within a timetable designed to comply with the collective agreement. For years, the Association has approved a limited number of "variances" to the instructional day to accommodate such courses.
