Collective Agreement Notes

Overpayment of Remedy AgreementOn July 29, 2022, the Surrey Teacher's Association signed a settlement agreement with the employer regarding overpayment of remedy. The employer will return to individual teachers' remedy banks 50% of the remedy they deducted in February 2019 in relation to the 2017-2019 school year. Read the entire agreement

Variance to the Instruction Day

Article D.22.1 of the collective agreement limits the length of a school's instructional day. Some courses involve multi-grade classes that do not fit neatly within a timetable designed to comply with the collective agreement. For years, the Association has approved a limited number of "variances" to the instructional day to accommodate such courses.

The process of looking at possible variances to the school day for the 2023 – 2024 secondary classes has begun. The variance application form is attached to this week's STAC. The forms need to be completed and returned to the STA office by November 15, 2022. Read more
