

School Absences

We are hearing from many schools that there are an extremely high number of absences of both staff and students, largely due to flu, cold, COVID and other respiratory illnesses. Last Thursday, the BCCDC removed the requirement for those diagnosed with COVID to isolate. It is still very important for everyone to follow these guidelines to reduce the transfer of infection in our schools:

- · Stay up to date on COVID and flu vaccines.
- If you are sick, stay home.
- Wash your hands.
- Limit close personal contact.
- Wear a mask to help reduce your chances of infection.

Employment Standards Act (ESA) Sick Leave

The Employment Standards Act (ESA) has recently changed as of March 31, 2022 and will affect!newer employees such as TTOCs. Employers are now required to provide a minimum of 5 days!of paid illness and injury (sick) leave per calendar year, for all employees who have been!employed for 90 consecutive calendar days.
