The freedom to learn... has been bought by bitter sacrifice. And whatever we may think of the curtailment of other civil rights, we should fight to the last ditch to keep open the right to learn..." #### Significant events in Black history in Canada



### Righting Canada's Wrongs: Africville

In the 1960s, after ignoring the Black community's repeated petitions for basic services, the City of Halifax bulldozed Africville in the name of urban renewal.

## **Health & Safety**

#### **Asbestos**

Asbestos is a naturally occurring mineral fiber, once widely used in building materials for its thermal insulating properties and fire resistance. Although the removal of asbestos from school buildings is an option for schools, many schools and local education agencies have chosen to manage some asbestos-containing building material in place.

Intact, undisturbed asbestos-containing materials generally do not pose a health risk. These materials may become hazardous and pose increased risk if they are damaged, are disturbed in some manner, or deteriorate over time and release asbestos fibers into building air.

When a school has been without water, electrical power, or heating service for two (2) hours or more the Principal / Vice Principal in charge will, if circumstances warrant, order the school or affected part to be closed in accordance with Board Policy 5207 and Regulation 5207.1
