

OPEN TO ALL SURREY STUDENTS

There are **4 Jennifer Wadge Social Justice Awards** open to any Grade 12 student at a Surrey public secondary school during the current school year. Deadline for applications for students graduating June 2023 is May 12, 2023. Recipients are awarded in June 2023.
