
RED HERRINGS

A red herring is information that is meant to distract from the main topic. The district's current attempt to focus attention on 50% administration/collaboration time for elementary teacher-librarians is a distraction from the fact of their planned cuts to library services in the 2023/2024 school year.

For the record, the STA **did not** ask the district to ensure that elementary school teacher-librarians have 50%collaboration/admin time.

We asked that funding that was bargained for to increase elementary prep time be used for additional prep staffing.

We **did not** ask for .05 changes to library entitlements because we know how difficult it is for members to find full-time work when .05 changes to entitlements are made. The district decided to shuffle 0.5 library entitlements from school to school causing great distress and disruption to teacher-librarians. They did this so that they can continue to argue in the media that 50% of a elementary teacher-librarian's entitlement is for collaboration. We have let the district know how disappointed we are at this tactic.



TRANSFER TIMELINES PROCESS

The Association has heard that principals are circumventing the Transfer Timeline process by sending their class organizations to the District without consulting with Staff Committees and/or providing opportunities for internal reassignments. This is a breach of Collective Agreement Articles **E.26.2** and **E.28**.



An issue has come to our attention regarding the application of retroactive pay for members who were on the first step of the local salary grid as of July 1, 2022. Members who were still on the bottom step of the salary grid at the time of implementation, or who were on the second step of the salary grid based on article B.1.6 in our Collective Agreement, should have moved up a step with a retroactive adjustment in pay from July 1, 2022. Pro-D Funding Draws



Tina Andersen, a teacher in Burnaby district, has had an [article published in The Tyee](#) in which she explains the impacts on the teacher shortage on her work each day. She wanted to share it with STA members. Here's an excerpt:

Behaviour issues among students have skyrocketed since I started teaching in the public school system in 1999. There have always been students with additional learning needs and neurodivergencies like autism. But this is different. When you sit kids down in a circle to teach a lesson, you can't really speak for more than a minute, sometimes 30 seconds, before you have to start addressing behaviours.
