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Shortlisted Without an Interview?



Truth and Reconciliation

Katzie Longhouse Reflection

I had the most profound day of learning at the Simon Pierre Longhouse on Katzie First Nation. It centred around learning the BC Song, which was gifted to educators and students by the Honourable Steven Point. Honourable Steven Point and Dr. Gwendolyn Point movingly spoke about the meaning of the song as well as the strength and resilience of Indigenous peoples. Coast Salish drummers played, and we had an opportunity to drum with them and sing the BC Song. I was so grateful to experience learning in the longhouse, warmed by the blazing fires and the teachings. Our wild salmon lunch was a fantastic treat and an opportunity to connect with colleagues and Katzie community members. In the afternoon, Anita McPhee, International Human Rights advocate, gave a powerful talk about Missing and Murdered Indigenous Women and Girls. She expertly wove in her story of vulnerability; being a young girl of 14 needing to move to Vancouver from her Nation up North to go to school. I am so glad to have had this experience as this was a professional day for the heart and mind.
