Collective Agreement Notes

2022/23 Round 3 postings will be as follows:

- Open June 23, 2022 Closes June 27, 2022
- Open July 21, 2022 Closes August 22, 2022
- From August 25, 2022 postings will be every Monday (Close Thursday) and Thursday (Close Monday) until Thanksgiving.
- After Thanksgiving postings will be every Thursday (Close Monday).

Reminder: Postings open and close at 4 pm.

Remedy

The provision of remedy arises from Letter of Understanding No.17 which was signed in March 2017 as a result of the Supreme Court of Canada decision in November 2016. The Supreme Court ordered the restoration of the BCPSEA-BCTF collective agreement provisions that were deleted by the <u>Public</u> <u>Education Flexibility and Choice Act</u> in 2002. **LOU 17 was meant to provide funding for improvements in teacher working conditions through the hiring of more teachers. Prep Time Rollover

Do you have a lot of missed Prep Time from this school year due to Failures to Fill? Do not fret! As per Article D.4.9 in the Working Conditions section of the Collective Agreement you are entitled to carry over your missed prep from this 2021-2022 school year to the next school year 2022-2023 even if you are moving to a new school. Check with your Admin to verify that all your missed prep is recorded. Read More

Shortlisted Without an Interview?

In our school district, the candidate with the most seniority is not always awarded the position. Due to language in our Collective Agreement, the job can be awarded to a less senior, but more suitable candidate. However, candidates with more seniority must be offered an interview. If you applied for a job in Round Two, please check the closed report published online on June 21, 2022. If the job was awarded to a candidate with less seniority than you, and you were not offered an interview, please contact Gavin Slade-Kerr, Health and Safety/Grievance Officer, at hs@surreyteachers.org.

Transfer Grievances

There are two main types of transfer grievances. In **qualification** grievances, a teacher is sometimes not shortlisted for an interview because the principal decided they were not qualified. In **suitability** grievances, a teacher was interviewed, but the principal considered a junior candidate demonstrably more suitable and offered them the job instead. Timelines are short to file a transfer grievance. Read more

Staff Reps

In September, your staff will hold elections for staff reps. Facts to know:

- The staff rep is **the peer of the principal** in matters related to the interpretation and application of the Collective Agreement at the school/site.
- The rights and responsibilities of the staff rep is firmly grounded in the Collective Agreement, in statute (Labour Code, School Act, Employment Standards Act, Workers' Compensation Act, Industrial Health and Safety Regulations) and in arbitration jurisprudence (case law, court decisions). 
