In May, there were record-breaking temperatures across the province. Surrey teachers reported a multitude of issues related to working and learning in overheated classrooms and portables. The STA sent out a survey to all members to gather information. These findings will be shared with the District.

- 95% of respondents reported 1:00-3:00 pm was
- the hottest time of day.
- 82% of respondents had more than 3 days of over 30 degrees in their classroom over 2 weeks. 42% of respondents chose to buy their own fan(s) for their classroom. Read more

Deadlines for Transferring TTOC credits

If you work as a teacher teaching on call (TTOC), you will accumulate your experience credit in your TTOC silo. If you also work in a contract, temporary, or continuing position, you will also earn experience credit in your contract silo. You can move your TTOC experience credit into your contract silo two times a year. You must make the request to move the experience credit by **June 30** to be effective by August 31, or by November 15 to be effective by December 31. Further Improvements to the Provincial EHB and Dental Plan

The BCTF recently reached an agreement with BCPSEA on further improvements to the provincial Extended Health Benefits (EHB) and Dental plan. Surrey was one of two districts whose members had dual dental restrictions that will be lifted as of July 1. If you recall, \$1.5 million of funding was allocated during provincial bargaining for improvements beginning on July 1, 2023, and a further \$2.0 million for improvements that will begin on July 1, 2024.
