
### STA CONNECTION

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
### STARA Meeting: June 14, 2023

#### **Shortlisted Without an Interview?**

In our school district, the candidate with the most seniority is not always awarded the position. Due to language in our Collective Agreement, the job can be awarded to a less senior, but more suitable candidate. However, candidates with more seniority must be offered an interview. If you applied for a job in Round Two, please check the Surrey School's Hub for the closed report which will be published on June 22, 2023. #### **Transfer Round Grievances**

There are two main types of transfer grievances. In qualification grievances, a teacher is sometimes not shortlisted for an interview because the principal decided they were not qualified. In suitability grievances, a teacher was interviewed, but the principal considered a junior candidate demonstrably more suitable and offered them the job instead. Read more

### **Deadlines for Transferring TTOC credits**

If you work as a teacher teaching on call (TTOC), you will accumulate your experience credit in your TTOC silo. If you also work in a contract, temporary, or continuing position, you will also earn experience credit in your contract silo. You can move your TTOC experience credit into your contract silo two times a year. You must make the request to move the experience credit by **June 30** to be effective by August 31, or by November 15 to be effective by December 31. ### June is both Pride Month and Indigenous Peoples' History Month

Read this article from <u>Trans Care BC</u> to learn more about the history and resources related to the Indigenous understandings of gender and spirituality. Here's an extract: "The role of Two-Spirit people in Indigenous communities is now being reclaimed, and it is becoming

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increasingly recognized that homophobia and transphobia are in direct contradiction with most traditional Indigenous values. Reclaiming the traditional roles and value placed on Two-Spirit people's gifts, is part of a larger healing process taking place within Indigenous communities."

Language plays a critical role in any culture. Using books that include Indigenous languages in your school will help your students to learn more about the cultures of the original stewards of this land. Ideas for using these books in your classroom:

- Read the same book in multiple languages with dual-language books.
- Research the Indigenous languages spoken where you live and across Turtle Island; where do
- they overlap?

- words out loud.
   Listen to a recording or watch a video of a speaker telling a story or singing a song in the language spoken where you live.
