Continuing the gratitude, I want to thank you for the extraordinary lengths to which you have gone to ensure the well-being and achievements of your students in these challenging times.

Our year started with expectations of a better contract given that we had an "education friendly" political party in power. The salary increases in the Collective Agreement that was ratified by a 94% vote in November 2022 have essentially evaporated given that food

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inflation for the past two year was 18%. Small wins were the increases in elementary prep time and the improvements in health benefits. In the new school year, we'll be talking to members about preparations for the next round of bargaining and how your workload and working conditions are determined by what's in the collective agreement, not by the "kindness" of the employer. Prep Time Rollover

Do you have a lot of missed Prep Time from this school year due to Failures to Fill? As per Article D.4.9 in the Working Conditions section on page 95 of the <u>Collective Agreement</u> you are entitled to carry over your missed prep from this 2022-2023 school year to the next school year 2023-2024 even if you are moving to a new school. Check with your Admin to verify that all your missed prep is recorded. Pro Tip: Keep a tracking document that records and calculates your missed and recovered prep.

Remedy Rollover

From the District: "Teachers with classes in remedy should have received notices for May minutes. Teachers with classes in remedy in June will receive emails in mid-June. Please check with your principals to see what your total remaining minutes are for the year and try to use minutes up by end of June. You can use minutes up to and including June 30. Minutes that are not used will be carried over to next year. We appreciate that it can be a challenge to take your remedy time and thank everyone for working to use the time this year."

Dual Dental Coverage Available Effective July 1, 2023

As a result of bargaining, the provincial parties have agreed to remove the collective agreement dual dental restrictions that were in place for teachers. There will no longer be a restriction preventing teachers from enrolling in the district's dental plan if they are currently ensured under a secondary dental plan. If you have previously waived your dental coverage due to a dual dental restriction, you can apply during the open enrolment period from July 1, 2023 through September 30, 2023. Applications received after September 30th will be subject to late applicants rules and restrictions. Read more

CPAP Coverage for Members on the Provincial EHB Plan

During recent negotiations with BCPSEA to improve our provincial Extended Health Benefits (EHB) Plan, the BCTF requested clarification on the coverage for CPAP machines required by members who experience sleep apnea. The BCPSEA benefits consultant assured us that our provincial EHB plan provides more than one CPAP machine per lifetime if the member has moderate to severe sleep apnea. See attached FAQ that lists the change in eligibility as of October 2018. Read more
