

Ministry Supports for New K-12 Reporting Policy

The Ministry of Education and Childcare released resources to support the new K-12 Reporting Policy. These materials, available on the <u>Ministry's Curriculum website</u>, include the <u>K-12 Student Reporting Policy – Educator Summary Guide</u>, as requested by the Federation. Other resources comprise a 40-minute <u>video presentation</u>, <u>webinars</u>, <u>guidelines</u>, informational sheets, and <u>information for parents and caregivers</u>. The policy is reinforced by updated Ministerial Orders, and the Federation will maintain communication with Local Presidents, addressing concerns with the Ministry throughout the school year. <u>Read more</u>

TTOC Extended Health Benefits Changes

Arbitrator Peltz's decision on July 20, 2023, determined that the separate Provincial Extended Health Benefits plan for Teachers Teaching on Call (TTOCs) violates Article B.11.3, which grants TTOCs access to the main plan. As per the ruling, TTOCs will now enroll in the same Provincial Extended Health Plan as contract teachers in their respective school districts and pay 100% of the premium costs for access. Read more
