
Call for Nominations



Article D.22. Tof the collective agreement limits the length of a school's instructional day. Some courses involve multi-grade classes that do not fit neatly within a timetable designed to comply with the collective agreement. For years, the Association has approved a limited number of "variances" to the instructional day in order to accommodate such courses.

The impacts of a global shortage of professional educators are felt acutely by Surrey teachers. Teachers are experiencing higher levels of stress and burnout as workload increases due to daily failures to fill. We know that the root cause of this crisis is poor working and learning conditions, and perhaps having management experience our working conditions – namely exploding class sizes/caseloads, violence, lack of supplies and resources – might be what it takes to collectively build a public education system that students and teachers deserve. Trans Parent Day - Nov 5th (First Sunday of the Month)


