#### Variance Application Package

Article D.22.1 of the collective agreement limits the length of a school's instructional day. Some courses involve multi-grade classes that do not fit neatly within a timetable designed to comply with the collective agreement. For years, the Association has approved a limited number of "variances" to the instructional day in order to accommodate such courses. #### **TTOC Experience Transfer Form**

Your pay increment (step level) is based on your teaching experience. Contract teachers advance one step on the pay scale after 10 months of full-time experience, occurring automatically on September 1 and January 1 each year. TTOCs can also move up the pay scale based on their experience: 17 TTOC days equal one contract month. There is a form to submit, and the deadline is November 15th. <u>Payroll won't do this unless</u> you request it. <u>Read more</u>

#### **Canada Without Poverty: Facts about Poverty**


