# **Social Justice**

## **Response to Feedback**

In response to recent feedback on our Statement regarding the war in Gaza, we encourage everyone to critically research the profound and lasting effects of current and historical injustices worldwide, particularly to children. As educators, our role is to introduce our students to the complexities of the world. Despite our desire for a world defined by peace and justice, the reality they may inherit is at risk due to ongoing inhumane injustices. Our hearts break for all the children born into communities ravaged by imperialist wars and various oppressions, including settler-colonialism. Recognizing that many of us, and our friends and family, are personally impacted by such injustices, we are deeply sorry for the losses and pain you have endured or are currently experiencing.

As you may or may not know, on October 18, 2023, the STA General Meeting carried an amendment to add the following to our Constitution and Bylaws:

To foster and promote the dignity of all persons regardless of age, ancestry, citizenship, colour, creed, disability, ethnic origin, family status, gender expression, gender identity, marital status, physical appearance, place of origin, political affiliation, race, religion, sex (including pregnancy and gender), sexual orientation or socioeconomic status as stated in the B.C. Human Rights Code.

Furthermore, the BCTF Fall Rep Assembly also voted to "donate \$50,000 to the UNRWA and [join] international calls for an immediate ceasefire as well as a release of all hostages."

We echo the sentiment of our provincial union, BCTF, that "kids matter, teachers care." As such, we unequivocally stand for the human rights of all our collective children around the world.
